WORK: Trail maintenance and environmental restoration projects 9:00 to 12:30
Groups from the Issaquah REI store, the Sierra Club and Bank of America will be joined by hundreds of individual volunteers to work on projects at Cybil Madeline Park in Issaquah, Luther Burbank Park on Mercer Island, Squak Mountain and the Swamp Trail at Tiger Mountain.

PARTY: Volunteer appreciation picnic 1:00-3:00 at Lake Sammamish State Park
From I-90 take exit 15, turn north, take the first left and follow signs to the park.

The 100-mile Mountains to Sound Greenway connects open spaces, trails, working farms and forests, historic towns, wildlife habitat and recreation opportunities just outside Washington's largest metropolitan area. The Greenway provides easy access to recreation and nature for millions of people in the Northwest.

The Mountains to Sound Greenway Trust is a nonprofit conservation organization established in 1991 to protect the Interstate 90 corridor between Seattle and Central Washington. The Greenway Trust works to promote public land acquisitions, connect a continuous regional trail system, teach people of all ages about the importance of conserving forests and wildlife, improve recreation access, create new parks and trails and mobilize thousands of volunteers. The Greenway portion of I-90 was the first interstate highway in the nation to be designated a National Scenic Byway.
